The facets of biblical justice

- 1. Radical ______.
 - Justice is taking what God has blessed you with and leveraging it for the good of those who are in need. Proverbs 22:9, Luke 12:32–33
 - We have a moral obligation to both God and those in need to use our goods unselfishly and with great generosity to serve, according to both our ability and their needs.
- 2. Universal ______.
 - Biblical justice requires that every person be treated according to the same standards and with the same respect, regardless of class, race, ethnicity, nationality, gender, or any other social category. James 2:1–4

- Jesus shocked the social sensibilities of the day by receiving and treating all classes of people with equal love and respect. Just as Jesus stood for equality so we must do the same.
- 3. Life-changing ______.
 - While we are to treat all equally, and not show partiality to any, we are to have special concern for the poor, the weak, and the powerless. Proverbs 31:8–9, Isaiah 58:6–7, James 1:27
 - We are acting justly and being an advocate when we take action to meet a material need in someone's life, when we empower others to gain self-sufficiency, and when we take on the social structures that disadvantage certain groups.
